# LET HIM BE MAGNIFIED

I love a good story. A true story is even better. One of my favorite true stories is that of missionary Corrie Ten Boom. During World War II she and her family were imprisoned at Ravensbruck Concentration Camp for helping Jews escape the Nazi regime. She and her sister Betsy, along with many others, were thrown into a dirty, overcrowded, flea infested barracks. Overcome by their living situation, Corrie cried desperately to Betsy, unsure of how to go on. Betsy recalled a Scripture they had read that morning from their smuggled Bible, "Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." 1 Thessalonians 5:16

Betsy exclaimed, "we should be thankful for the fleas." Corrie thought it near impossible to give thanks for fleas, but she was faithful and did so. They searched for things to be thankful for in that wretched situation....being together, the warmth of all their bodies so close together, their smuggled Bible, and the list went on. Seems impossible, right? To thank God for fleas????

On days when you feel like your feet are being held to the flame, how does one go about thanking God for the fleas in your life? Having recently walked through days where clouds hung heavy and it was difficult to see the sunshine, I'd say some days are harder than others to stop and give thanks. Some days you have to be very intentional. Some days you have to search hard and dig deep. Some days it's a sacrifice to bring an offering of thanks to God. But it's on those days, that this thankfulness alters our eyesight and we catch a glimpse of God at work. Our thankfulness brings glory and honor to Him who holds all things together, giving hope for this world and the next.

"Let them sacrifice thank offerings and tell of his works with songs of joy." Psalm 107:22

Weeks later Betsy returned to the barracks elated. She explained to Corrie that after an interaction with the guards she realized why the guards never bothered to visit their barracks, leaving the women with enough freedom to hold Bible Study, read Scripture, and sing hymns together. It was because of the fleas. The guards knew that their Unit was so infested with fleas that they would never enter their barracks. Never had they been so thankful for the fleas!!!!

So, on the days when you need to dig deep in the dirt of this life to find something to be thankful for, may the Lord help you recognize the purpose of the fleas. And until He does so, may we trust Him enough that He will carry us through.
